Open Access literature is

- Digital
- Online
- Free of charge available on the public internet
- Free of most copyright and licensing restrictions
- Worldwide visible for anyone
- Any user is permitted to read, download, copy, distribute, search, print or link to the fulltext
- Not free to reproduce, preserve or publish; the author decides the conditions

2 Types of Open Access

- Self archiving: The Green Road
 - ✓ on your personal website, blog, university webpage
 - ✓In the institutional repository: Radboud Repository
- Open Access Journals:

The Golden Road



Radboud Repository

The Green Road

- Database containing the scholarly publications of RU researchers
- Scholarly articles: pre- and postprints
- Dissertations
- Conference papers
- Book chapters



The Radboud Repository: part of (inter)national repository network

- Institutional repository for RU since 2005
 - Metadata (publication details)
 - Full-text of articles where available and where copyright allows
- Articles are indexed for search engines like Google Scholar
- Dutch IRs jointly accessible through <u>NARCIS</u> (KNAW)
- Content backed up in e-depot of KB
- RR: currently 90,000 records and 32,380 full-text




NARCIS

- The Dutch electronic network for university repositories
- KNAW maintains Narcis
- Search all Dutch university repositories at once with one search
- Includes theses (53,500) and datasets (27,500) which can be searched separately
- 756,900 publications in total
- 313,500 full text in Open Access











The Golden Road

- Open Access Journals
 - Peer reviewed scholarly journals
 - Freely and openly available on the web
 - No charge to readers
 - Author pays a fee to the publisher
 Academic staff of RU can get discount on publishers fees.
 NWO encourages participants in their research projects to publish in Open Access. Each NWO-project has a budget of € 5000 at its disposal for this purpose.
 - Versus toll access by (commercial) publishers

Open Access: why it's right

- Wellcome Trust: "It is a fundamental part of our charitable mission to ensure that the work we fund can be read and utilised by the widest possible audience. We therefore support unrestricted access to the published outputs of research through our open access policy."
- NWO "shares the opinion that research results funded by the public should be **fully accessible** to the public. For NWO Open Access is the only way forward."



Open Access: why it's right

- Berlin Declaration 2003: "Establishing open access as a worthwhile procedure ideally requires the active commitment of each and every individual producer of scientific knowledge and holder of cultural heritage."
- The Radboud University supports the declaration together with more than a hundred other international universities and research organisations.
- Institutions increasingly require deposit in the institutional repositories (Glasgow, EUR, Eindhoven)



Why it makes sense Benefits OA for you and your audience

- Faster and wider dissemination of research, including developing countries
- Without costs for readers
- Impact increase: citations and usage
- Better chance of longterm preservation
- Open exchange of ideas benefits society
- Facilitates the development of new knowledge
- Lower costs to produce publications

Future Radboud Repository and OA in RU

Developments planned:

- Fulltext available in Kennisbank
- Usage statistics of your publications
- Connections between different related objects (enhanced publications) e.g. data, movies, software
- Sustainable long term storage



University Library supports initiatives by researchers

- European publication platform, open access, not for profit
- Professional alternative for the Radboud researcher
 - starting a new journal
 - publishing a book
- · Quality assurance, distribution, marketing and promotion



How we can help?

- We derive basis data from Metis
- We can digitise full-text (Zeutsel)
- We ensure copyright is respected (legal restrictions and guidelines RU)
- We maintain an embargo on access where necessary
- Copyright Information Point (CIP)
- We keep you informed about OA issues
- We are developing more services
